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Removable Prosthodontics and the “3-4-5” Rule for Determining Lack of Posterior Balanced Occlusion

Resin-based partial dentures (D5211 and D5212) are a benefit when replacing an anterior tooth or when the arch lacks posterior balanced occlusion. Cast metal framework removable partial dentures (D5213 and D5214) are a benefit when the arch lacks posterior balanced occlusion and the appliance will oppose a complete denture.

The “3-4-5” Rule can help providers determine whether the arch in question lacks posterior balanced occlusion.

The “3-4-5” Rule for evaluating for lack of posterior balanced occlusion:

- The “3” criterion is met when the 1st and 2nd molars and the 2nd premolar are missing on the same side of the arch.
- The “4” criterion is met when all four 1st and 2nd molars are missing in the same arch.
- The “5” criterion is met when a total of five posterior permanent teeth are missing in the arch (excluding 3rd molars).

Here are some examples:

- An arch missing teeth #29, 30, and 31 meets the “3” criterion because the second premolar and both molars are missing on the same side of the arch.
- An arch missing teeth #2, 3, 14, and 15 meets the “4” criterion because all four molars are missing in the same arch.
- An arch missing teeth #18, 20, 21, 28, and 30 meets the “5” criterion because a total of five posterior teeth are missing in the arch. The presence or absence of teeth #17 or 32 does not contribute to the five missing posterior teeth.
- An arch missing tooth #8 only does not lack posterior balanced occlusion. However, it would qualify for a resin based removable partial denture (RPD) (D5211) due to the missing anterior tooth. It would not qualify for a cast metal framework (D5213) because a cast metal framework RPD is only a benefit when an arch lacks posterior balanced occlusion and it will oppose a complete denture.

RPDs require prior authorization in Medi-Cal Dental. A Treatment Authorization Request (TAR) for removable prosthodontics must include the Medi-Cal Dental Justification of Need for Prosthesis DC054 form except for immediate dentures (D5130 and D5140) under certain circumstances. Prior authorization for immediate dentures is not required except when the prosthesis on the opposing arch requires prior authorization. Providers should note that the DC054 form was updated in 2024 and the most recent version (2/24) of the form must be used. The latest version of the form includes instructions embedded within to aid the provider in successful authorization of procedures and also includes reminders of updated policies regarding replacement after non-catastrophic loss or misplacement.
